Key Knowledge about Mixed Media Art

- **Mixed media art** is a pictorial form of art that combines different materials in a single image to show elements of shape, texture, tone and colour.
- Because it involves mixing different creative mediums, mixed media art breaks the boundaries between different art forms.
- In many cases the mixed media approach helps to draw attention to how very different parts come together to create a complex representation.
- **Collage** is one type of mixed media art and involves combining different materials such as paper, fabric, photographs, paint and drawings to create a new whole.

Recall and Remember:

The six most important elements in art are: **Line, Colour, Shape, Form, Space and Texture.**

These can be used individually, or combined together to create more impact such as in mixed media art.

- Jenna Douglas is a mixed media artist who works on paper using layers of paint and collage.



Her work is about people's relationship with places.

- Eva Magill-Oliver creates collages, drawings, and paintings that reflect and explore different elements of beauty in the natural world.



She uses pencil, pen, ink, and collage to create structured textural designs to represent those found in the environment.

When you create your mixed media artwork, remember to...

- ✚ Draw sketches and try out ideas with different materials, shapes, textures and colour tones before you begin your final piece.
- ✚ Consider the theme of your piece and choose materials, shapes, textures and tones that reflect what you are trying to portray.
- ✚ Decide on the composition of your picture. What is the main focus in the foreground? What is in the background?
- ✚ Think about additional details - do you need any to add elements of light (reflection) or any shade



Key Vocabulary

Mixed Media	Art in which more than one type of material has been used.
Collage	Art made by sticking various different materials to a backing.
Concept	An idea that leads to specific form of drawing or painting.
Combine	To join objects or materials together to form a single unit.
Structure	The arrangement of main components into a specific design.
Shape	The external form or outline of something.
Texture	The feel or appearance of a surface.
Tone	The intensity (strength or depth) of a colour.
Contrast	The state of being strikingly different from something else.
Technique	Use a particular method or skill.
Refine	Make changes to improve the final piece.
Analyse	To examine something in detail, to explain and interpret it.
Critique	Express an analysis of the merits and faults of work of art.
Exhibit	Show a piece of work so it can be appreciated by an audience.
