KEY KNOWLEDGE

Christians believe God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings.

As human beings are part of God's good creation, they do best when they listen to God.

Christians believe God made our wonderful world and we should look after it.

What should I already know?

Christians believe in God

Christians believe that God made the world

Christians believe that Jesus was sent to save them and to say "sorry" for bad things

Christians follow Jesus' teachings about how to behave

What will I know by the end of the unit?

Make sense of belief:

- Place the concepts of God and Creation on a timeline of the Bible's 'big story'
- Make clear links between Genesis 1 and what Christians believe about God and Creation
- Recognise that the story of 'the Fall' in Genesis 3 gives an explanation of why things go wrong in the world.

Understand the impact:

- Describe what Christians do because they believe God is Creator (e.g. follow God, wonder at how amazing God's creation is; care for the Earth – some specific ways)
- Describe how and why Christians might pray to God, say sorry and ask for forgiveness.

Make connections

 Ask questions and suggest answers about what might be important in the Creation story for Christians and for non-Christians living today.

Core Learning -

- ~ God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings.
- ~ As human beings are part of God's good creation, they do best when they listen to God.

KEY VOCABULARY

God: Christians believe that God is the creator.

Christian: A person who has received a Christian baptism or is a believer in Christianity.

Creator: A person or thing that creates things.

Genesis: The first book of the Bible that includes the Creation story.

The Creation Story: The Christian story about how the universe began.

The Fall: The part of the creation story where Adam and Eve ate the fruit.

Adam and Eve: The first man and woman on Earth.

Forgiveness: To stop feeling anger or resentment towards someone.

The serpent: The craftiest wild animal Lord God ever made.

The Ten Commandments: 10 commandments that show Christians how to love God.

Opportunities for teaching diversity, equality and expanding cultural capital

- -Learning about other religions and their core beliefs, expanding cultural awareness.
- -Learning about how to shoe respect to different people who hold different faiths and beliefs.
- -Investigating how different people celebrate milestones in life, including those who do not have a religious belief promoting respect and tolerance.

Key Questions

What is wonderful about the world?

What instructions does God give to humans for treating the Earth as God's creation?

What is 'The Fall' and why is it an important Christian belief?

Why is saying sorry and important part of being a Christian?

Why is forgiveness an important part of being a Christian?

How do the concepts of God and Creation fit into the timeline of the Bible's 'Big Story'?

What are the links between Genesis 1 and what Christians believe about God and Creation?

What do Christians do because they believe God is creator?

What will I learn by the end of the key stage?

- Identify and describe the core beliefs and concepts studied
- Make clear links between texts/sources of authority and the key concepts studied
- Offer informed suggestions about what texts/sources of authority might mean and give examples of what these sources mean to believers
- Make simple links between stories, teachings and concepts studied and how people live, individually and in communities
- Describe how people show their beliefs in how they worship and in the way they live
- Identify some differences in how people put their beliefs into practice
- Raise important questions and suggest answers about how far the beliefs and practices studied might make a difference to how pupils think and live
- Make links between some of the beliefs and practices studied and life in the world today, expressing some ideas of their own clearly
- Give good reasons for the views they have and the connections they make
- Talk about what they have learned and if they have changed their thinking
